Opelika punches ticket to championship game

Opelika running back CJ Johnson broke free for a game-icing run into Auburn High territory in the final two minutes, and the Bulldogs topped Auburn High 31-28 in the ultimate rivalry game Friday night to advance to the Class 7A state championship.

Opelika will face Thompson at 7 p.m. Dec. 3 in the Super 7 at Protective Stadium in Birmingham.

Johnson and Opelika staved off a furious late rally bid from Auburn High, after leading 31-14 in the fourth. It was Johnson who broke loose for a 57-yard touchdown to put the Bulldogs up 31-14 with 11:14 to go.

Auburn High scored two touchdowns late to cut the lead, including a 9-yard touchdown run by Cason Myers to make it 31-28 with 1:44 left.

Auburn High kicked the ball off to Opelika needing to get a stop to get the ball back, but that's when Johnson broke loose on another huge run down to the Auburn High 25-yard line. Opelika was able to kneel out the clock soon after.

Opelika led 21-14 at the half after a backand-forth first two quarters. Then Opelika kicker Reese Beasley gave the Bulldogs a two-score lead with a 30-yard field goal to make it 24-14 with 1:38 left in the third

Opelika's Xavier Thomas opened the game with fireworks, running back a 34yard interception return for a touchdown on just the second play of the game.

Auburn High responded with a 16-play scoring drive capped by a touchdown run by defensive lineman and Kansas State commit Carnell Jackson in the jumbo package – and they went back and forth from there.

Opelika's Blake Johnson punched in his own touchdown from 1-yard out to put Opelika back ahead with 1:24 left in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Cason Myers hit Levi Kelly for a 16-yard touchdown with 7:52 left before the break to tie it 14-14.

But that tie was short-lived as Opelika's CJ Johnson returned the ensuing kickoff 95
