




20years later

Hurricane Katrina reshapes coastal AL fishing town

n the weeks after Hurricane Katrina, then-Bayou la Batre mayor Stan Wright said he saw a sign someone had put up outside city hall that preached "hurricane readiness." • "I told my guy to pull it up and throw it in the dumpster," Wright remembered with a scoff and a shake of his head. "Hurricane readiness.' You're not ready for that, there is no hurricane readiness — that's like tempting God or something." ● Wright — like much of the town - is proudly blue collar to the bone and has earned his living in commercial fishing for years. Nestled on Alabama's Gulf Coast, the coastal fishing town had always survived storms with minimal damage. • They survived again when Hurricane Katrina struck 20 years ago but were worse for wear. Forty-seven fishing boats and the detritus from hundreds of homes littered the shore, thanks to a storm surge recorded to be between 12-14 feet. • Beyond the debris, it's a community where, decades later, residents say they still feel forgotten in their continuing effort to recover.
