Trump to cut clean energy funding

Administration to eliminate \$7.6B in grants in 16 states led by Democrats

WASHINGTON — The Trump administration is canceling \$7.6 billion in grants that supported hundreds of clean energy projects in 16 states, all of which voted for Democrat Kamala Harris in last year's presidential election.

The move comes as President Donald Trump threatens deep cuts in his fight with congressional Democrats over the government shutdown.

The Energy Department said in a statement Thursday that

223 projects were terminated after a review determined they did not adequately advance the nation's energy needs or were not economically viable. Officials did not provide details about which projects are being cut, but said funding came from the Office of Clean Energy Demonstrations, Office of Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy, and other DOE bureaus.

The cuts are likely to affect battery plants, hydrogen tech-

Oklahoma City set for 2 Olympic contests

Softball, canoe slalom will be held at sites that already are being used

OKLAHOMA CITY — Some of the events planned for the Summer Olympics in Los Angeles in 2028 are far from the heart of the city. There's soccer at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. There's volleyball at the Honda Center in Anaheim. There's surfing at Lower Trestles just south of San Clemente.

But two competitions are so far-flung that they're out of state: canoe slalom and softball, both of which will be held in Oklahoma City.

That's right: the Los Angeles Olympics won't entirely be in the Los Angeles area. As the city prepares to host the 2028

New, updated fire stations, new HQ part of \$227M plan

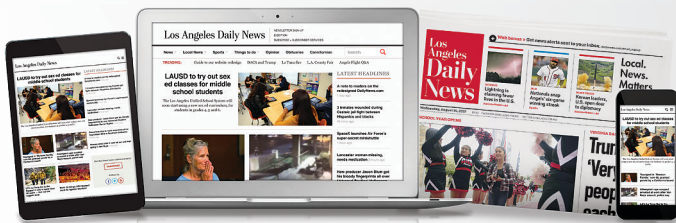
