Risk of catastrophic blast from chemical tank drops

Threat of most serious possible explosion lessens, fire official says

The most serious threat of a catastrophic explosion of the malfunctioning chemical storage tank at a Garden Grove aerospace company no longer exists, the incident commander said Sunday, but the danger of an uncontrolled blast remains.

Division Chief Craig Covey of the Orange County Fire Authority said in an interview with freelance news organization OnScene.TV that firefighters had previously been unable to examine the top of the tank at GKN Aerospace on Western Avenue because of the fear of an explosion.

But overnight, they found a crack that may be relieving enough pressure to prevent a massive explosion that could damage buildings and release a toxic vapor cloud.

“That was the success of that intel,” Covey said. “That changes the trajectory of everything and reduces its potential impact on the earth. I’m not saying it can’t explode. The difference is, like, a gas explosion in a building versus a bomb hitting it. So, once we remove that, that really decreases the impact footprint that we’re managing right now, and we can reevaluate our current evacuation.”

A new operation would be conducted Sunday night,

Newsom asks for federal emergency declaration to bolster response

Gov. Gavin Newsom has formally requested a federal emergency declaration to aid with the ongoing response at a chemical storage tank at a Garden Grove aerospace company.

Experts and emergency crews have been working since Thursday to try to prevent a

potentially catastrophic chemical spill or explosion at GKN Aerospace. The tank is filled with 7,000 gallons of a highly flammable chemical called methyl methacrylate. Crews have so far been unable to find a solution to end the threat posed by the tank, from which a blast could damage hundreds of homes and buildings in the area and create a toxic plume
