Haros charged with murder of their son

Couple makes first court appearance since arrest; neither one enters plea

A Cabazon husband and wife were each charged with murder Tuesday, accused of killing their 7-month-old son Emmanuel, whose body remains missing amid an ongoing search that has made headlines nationwide for nearly two weeks.

Jake Haro, 32, and Rebecca Haro, 41, were also each charged with filing a false police report, a misdemeanor.

Hours later, the Haros made their first court appearance in the case at the Riverside Hall of Justice. They were placed almost as far apart as possible — Rebecca Haro sitting in the jury box in a blue jail jumpsuit and

Dozens wounded as Israel raids West Bank city

RAMALLAH, West Bank — Israeli forces carried out a rare daytime raid on Tuesday in the heart of the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah, where the Palestinian Authority is headquartered. Dozens of Palestinians were wounded, according to local medics, as people throwing stones scattered after gunfire

and tear gas.

Israel said it targeted money exchanges linked to Hamas. But the raid was likely to further undermine the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority as it seeks to capitalize on the recent decision by some major Western countries to recognize Palestinian state-

Report buoys light-rail project

L.A. Metro A Line extension to Montclair could add \$45.9M in labor income over 6 years

The planned 3.3-mile extension of the A Line light rail from Pomona to Montclair will pump millions of dollars and add hundreds of high-paying construction jobs into San Bernardino County, a new study says.

During six years of construction, from 2026 through 2032, the Claremont-Montclair extension will add 580 jobs for a labor income boost of \$45.9 million, according to the report from Kleinhenz Economics. The average worker added would earn \$73,100 annually. In addition, the economy in San Bernardino County would receive an \$80.3 million injection over six years from dollars kicked in by the San Bernardino County Construction Transportation Authority.

The report, released by the Metro Gold Line Foot-hill Extension Construction Authority last week,

DOGE risked Social Security data, filing says

WASHINGTON — Members of the Department of Government Efficiency uploaded a copy of a crucial Social Security database in June to a vulnerable cloud server, putting the personal information of hundreds of millions of Americans at risk of being leaked or hacked, according to a whistleblower complaint filed by the Social Security Administration's chief data officer.

The database contains records of all Social
