Trump: Oil tanker seized 'for a very good reason'

The United States has seized an oil tanker off the coast of Venezuela amid a monthslong buildup of military forces surrounding the country, President Donald Trump confirmed Dec. 10.

"As you probably know, we've just seized a tanker on the coast of Venezuela," Trump said at a meeting at the White House. "Largest one ever seized, actually. And other things are happening."

Trump declined to provide additional details about the tanker to reporters and said the administration would be releasing more information at a later time.

"You see the result, and I guess they probably released the pictures by now pretty soon," Trump said. "You'll discuss that with the appropriate people later

The president added, "It was seized for a very good reason."

Ventura's Burch Studio turns amateur musicians into pros

It's not enough to just learn to play the guitar. Bands should learn how to write a song, put together a set list and have a photo shoot. That's what musicians learn at Burch Studio in Ventura and the advent of generative artificial intelligence with music in the last few years haven't changed a thing.

"The purpose is to create community by making music and I want it to function like a record label," said Burch Studio owner Aaron Burch, 45, who lives in midtown Ventura. "I want to give a young band the experience of being a bigger band."

On Dec. 12, bands that have learned the ropes will showcase their talent in an all-ages concert at the Ventura Majestic Theater. Tickets for the 7 p.m. show at 26 S. Chestnut St. are \$32 with fees.

Judge orders release of Abrego Garcia from jail


