Hopes to salvage event hinge on finding new owner

Delaware has said goodbye to beloved festivals including Firefly and the Bob Marley-inspired People's Festival in recent years, and now the Ladybug Music Festival is joining that list after 13 years in Wilming-

Gayle Dillman, co-founder of Ladybug and Gable Music Ventures, announced her retirement Oct. 1, signaling the end of the long-running event.

Still, there's a chance Ladybug could live on if a business steps in to purchase it.

Launched in 2012, Ladybug was Dillman's biggest accomplishment with Gable: a free festival devoted to featuring 100% female-fronted acts. Dillman has put out feelers and is hopeful another business steps up to

Mortgage swings drive fall trends in **DE** housing

Market cools as homes linger; prices slide despite Fed cut

Trends in home sales this fall, both new construction and existing homes, depend on mortgage rates, according to national associations representing those industries.

But in a frustrating turn, despite the Federal Reserve's cutting the short-term interest rate on Sept. 17, mortgage rates actually rose.

Before looking at what's affecting mortgages, here's a look at trends for existing home sales, not new construction, in Delaware, from Scott Farnan. president of the Delaware Association of Realtors.
