## Conditions 'deplorable,' detainee's fiancée says

Standing in the sticky August heat on Sunday, Aug. 10, Sonia Bichara gripped a microphone outside the gates of the migrant detention facility in the Everglades, a site now officially known as Alligator Alcatraz.

She recounted to more than 100 people what her fiancé, Rafael Collado, had de-

scribed from inside: worms in the food, toilets overflowing and undrinkable water that smells. After one month inside, she said, he joined other detainees in a hunger strike

While she was speaking to the crowd, her phone rang. A detainee named Alex Reyes was calling from inside the facility. Bichara put him on speaker, and the vigil crowd fell silent. He spoke in Spanish, describing the stifling tents and meager meals. Bichara cried as she listened.

In an email to the Naples Daily News and The News-Press, Stephanie Hartman, director of communications at the Florida Division of Emergency Management, rejected those allegations of poor treatment.

"These claims are false," Hartman wrote. "Detainees have access to clean, sanitary facilities with fully functioning air conditioning in all tents. They also
