## TrumpRx offers 600 generic drugs

### Uninsured Floridians can choose from list

The millions of Floridians who don't have health insurance will be able to choose from an expanded catalog of 600 generic prescriptions on the TrumpRx.gov platform, President Donald Trump announced May 18.

And it might offer lower prices than the out-of-pocket costs found on insured prescription plans, Trump said. The direct-to-consumer website, which went live in February, has been part of the Trump administration's bid to lower Americans' prescription drug prices, even if the price of going to the doctor has gone up.

The president has long complained about how the same prescriptions, such as GLP-1 medications, which Trump calls "the fat shot," have been notably less expensive in other developed nations.

Following the launch of TrumpRx, the Trump administration negotiated most-favored nation deals with 17 large drug companies.

"We were subsidizing the world and now there's no more of that," Trump said as the site launched Feb. 5.

Still, there was a snag: Up until May 18, the website had only brand-name drugs from those 17 companies available.

Now, however, TrumpRx will refer people to private-sector online pharmacies and drug-pricing websites, including television personality and entrepreneur Mark Cuban's Cost Plus Drugs, Amazon Pharmacy and GoodRx.

RIVIERA BEACH – Brilliant. Fearless. Undaunted.

Those were some of the words used to remember the life of Inlet Grove High School graduate Toryann Mcfarlane as dozens of family members, classmates, teachers and coworkers gathered for a vigil near the beach on Singer Island on the evening of May 19.

Mcfarlane died in a traffic crash early on May 13, just two days after she graduated from Inlet Grove.

Those attending the vigil, which ran for more than 90 minutes, shared memories and stories. They lit candles as day turned to night. Several released balloons as the crowd gathered near the volleyball courts. Moses Baker, an administrator at Inlet Grove, described Mcfarlane as having an infectious smile.

### Wanted for Brothers to the Rescue killings in 1996

MIAMI –A U.S. grand jury has indicted Raúl Castro, among the last surviving comandantes of the 1959 Cuban revolution, for the shooting deaths of four crew members on Brothers to the Rescue aircrafts three decades ago.

Acting Attorney General Todd

Blanche and other U.S. Justice Department officials revealed the conspiracy charges against Castro, as well as accomplices he did not identify, in his remarks at an event in Miami commemorating Cuba's independence following the Spanish-American War on May 20.

"For nearly 30 years, 30 years, the families of four murdered Americans

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
