aren and Jeff Groff have read the same children's books to their son Danny for nearly four decades. • At 6-foot-1, 39-year-old Danny Groff enjoys sitting between his parents on their couch in Upper Arlington, Ohio, holding a stuffed Bert Muppet toy. He leans in toward his mother as she reads "Curious George Rides a Bike," and breaks into a smile when she whispers, "George got curious." • Danny Groff has Lennox-Gastaut syndrome, a rare and severe type of epilepsy that typically develops in early childhood. About 50,000 people in the United States and 1 million people worldwide have the condition, according to the LGS Foundation. Every time a seizure happens, brain damage occurs that can lead to learning difficulties and other lifelong disabilities. Danny Groff has seizures daily, and Karen Groff said he has the developmental abilities of a 2-year-old.

The Dunnellon City Council at its Sept. 10 meeting unanimously selected Reese Taschenberger to fill a seat on the board left vacant on and off again since December 2023.

"Welcome to the city council," Mayor Walter Green said after the vote.

Taschenberger's appointment was taken up toward the end of the meeting. With no public comment, Councilmember Valerie Hanchar nominated

chenberger walked to the front where he was greeted by City Clerk Mandy Odom, where a short swearing-in ceremony was held.

Taschenberger was then congratulated by his colleagues as he sat in the District 2 chair.

City officials had received Taschenberger's application for the job that pays \$150 per month in late August.

Taschenberger will serve until November 2026 when he will be up for reelection. Councilmembers serve fourvear terms.

As the meeting continued, Taschenberger's first official act as a councilmember came when he seconded a motion to end the meeting, which drew a round of applause.

Green told a Star-Banner reporter at the conclusion of the meeting that Taschenberger is a descendant of the Williams family for which U.S. 41 is named. The mayor said the Williams family has been in Dunnellon for decades and has contributed to the evolution of the community.

In a previous interview with a Star-Banner reporter, Taschenberger said he cares for the city and can offer new ideas to the council.
