'My duty was to serve'

From kamikaze patrol to the front porch: At 106, WWII vet lives 'one day at a time'

At 106, Joseph Williams still takes life one day at a time, watching cars speed by from his front porch, sharing stories of a world he helped shape - and reminding anyone who'll listen what it was like to serve in World War II.

As he watches drivers on Orange Av-



enue race to where they're going, Williams thinks about where he's been. After all, he's lived through more than a century of history.

"I'm glad to be alive,"

Williams was summoned to service by the draft, as many young men in the 1940s were, and joined the Navy during the last two years of World War II.

Once the war ended, he returned to his home in Wakulla County where he lived up until two years ago.

Now he spends his days enjoying the afternoon from the porch of the Tallahassee home where he lives with his granddaughter, making periodic trips to his old Wakulla home and fielding requests for appearances in parades and



3-year-old dead after unreported shooting

A three-year-old is dead in northwest Tallahassee after an apparent gunshot wound to the head on the morning of Nov. 9.

Javonni Hampton, a spokesperson with the Leon County Sheriff's Office, confirmed the tragedy occurred in the 4200 block of Augustus Oak Court though it was not reported by the agency, which regularly releases incident alerts on Facebook and via press release.

"It's just under investigation right now," she told the Tallahassee Democrat.

She was not able to confirm if someone is in custody at this time. She said she couldn't release the gender of the child. She could not say if the child was an intended target, if the shooting was an accident or self-inflicted.
