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Bear Warriors United fights Florida's December bear hunt

A wildlife conservation group has filed a complaint against the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, saying it violated state law in how it developed rules to resume an annual black bear hunting season.

In a challenge filed Aug. 15 with the state's Division of Administrative Hearings, Bear Warriors United argued the FWC's rules for a December hunt are an

improper use of its rule-making powers.

The group's attorney, Raquel Levy of Daytona Beach, said the FWC did not follow its own procedures, violated its charter to include scientific data and public input in management decisions, and denied due process to the public.

Bear Warriors seeks to block the FWC from issuing any bear hunting permits until all legal appeals have been exhausted. The FWC does not comment on pending litigation.



hunting season in 1994 when the bear population was around 1,000. Bears have since increased to around 4,000, based on projections from a 2014 count. A new bear population estimate is expected in 2030.

A coalition of conservation groups have been working to block the hunt ever since FWC chair Rodney Barreto directed the agency's biologists to develop a hunt last December. That request

Could Polk's US reps face new districts for 2026 elections?

For U.S. House members facing two-year election cycles, the campaigning never really ends.

All four representatives from Polk County are seeking additional terms in 2026. The question is: What districts will they be running in?

The possibility of an unprecedented, mid-decade redrawing of congressional maps has created uncertainty around the districts now held by Rep. Scott Franklin, R-Lakeland; Rep. Laurel Lee, R-Tampa; Rep. Darren Soto, D-Kissimmee; and Rep. Daniel Webster, R-Clermont.

President Donald Trump has been pressuring states to redraw maps, in hopes of boosting Republicans' chances of retaining their narrow majority in the U.S. House. Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis has signaled support for a revision of Florida's maps, under which Republicans now hold 20 of 28 House seats.

Florida House Speaker Daniel Perez, R-Miami, announced on Aug. 7 that he would create a committee in September to study redistricting.

The Florida Constitution directs the Legislature to create new congressional maps every 10 years, using U.S.
