The worst kept secret in town is out — Harry and the Natives is now open.

The restaurant and tiki bar on the shore of Lake Okahumpka in the Village of St. Johns launched its soft opening phase Monday to much excitement.

Ashley Moody Visits American Legion for Pinning Ceremony

For U.S. Navy veteran Danny Boone, receiving a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin from U.S. Sen. Ashley Moody was a moving experience.

Boone and about 80 other Vietnam War veterans were pinned by Moody during a ceremony Monday at American Legion Post 347 in Lady Lake. The event

was part of the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War Commemoration.

"It was a wonderful event," said Boone, of the Village of Osceola Hills at Soaring Eagle Preserve. "It's nice that others are thankful for our service."

USPS UNVEILS POSTAGE STAMP TO HONOR PRESIDENT JIMMY CARTER

There will soon be a new spot to honor former President Jimmy Carter: the corner of an envelope. The U.S. Postal Service will launch a Forever

stamp commemorating Carter on Oct. 1, which would have been his 101st birthday. The stamp will be issued during a ceremony that day in Atlanta, the home of the Carter Presidential Center and where he served as governor.

Collectors and Carter enthusiasts can preorder the stamp online at usps.com/stamps starting Sept. 1, with orders arriving around early October, according to a spokesperson. The stamp also will be sold at post offices nationwide Oct. 1.

Carter, who died at age 100 on Dec. 29 in his hometown of Plains, is the only Georgian to win a term in the White House. He joins an illustrious lineup of others with Peach State ties to land the distinct but diminutive prize of gracing a stamp. Those include the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., Rep. John Lewis and golf great Bobby Jones.

PRESIDENTS TO **PUT ON STAMPS?**

HOW DO THEY PICK

Presidents are memorialized on stamps after they die, according to the government's stamp selection criteria. Since 1945, the nation's leaders have been featured on stamps typically within a year of their death, the Postal Service says on its website.

The agency issued a stamp for George H.W. Bush, who died in 2018, on his birthday in June of the following year. Meanwhile, George Washington, the nation's first president, has appeared on more than 300 different stamps.


