Three in 10 Americans

engage in birding each year, according to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Backyard birders lead the flock, with 95% of birders watching feathered friends from the comfort of their homes. Nearly half (44%) of people travel on birding adventures a mile or more from their home. The average birder is 49 years old, but the activity is particularly popular among those aged 55 and older. Americans spent a combined 7.5 billion days birding in 2022, with backyard birders averaging 67 days and those

traveling averaging 34 days.
