Avoid these problem areas downtown

Workers returned to Broad Street on Monday to start the next phase of improvements to downtown Augusta's main traffic corridor. But even Augusta's engineering department needs extra help for bigger lifts. Construction on Broad Street affecting the 800 block by Augusta Common and the 1300 and 1400 blocks is labeled an improvement by the city. But until it's completed, it's spurring questions about lane closures, traffic detours, and business access that the city can't always answer right away.

The Augusta Commission recently voted to approve up to \$315,000 for

4 dead, at least 20 hurt in shooting at bar in SC

Four people were killed and at least 20 others injured in a shooting at a busy South Carolina bar on Oct. 12, authorities say.

The shooting occurred shortly before 1 a.m. at Willie's Bar and Grill on St. Helena Island, about an hour north of Hilton Head, according to the Beaufort County Sheriff's Office. Multiple victims were transported to area hospitals. Among those injured, at least four were in critical condition.

The office declined to release the

names of those killed pending notification of family members.

"Multiple victims and witnesses ran

to the nearby businesses and properties seeking shelter from the gunshots," the sheriff's office said in a statement.

Hundreds of people were at the scene when police arrived.

Authorities said they were looking into persons of interest in the shooting but did not immediately provide further details. USA TODAY has reached out for additional information.
