## Properties designated historic landmarks

Iowa City has given final approval to designate a bundle of properties on the edge of the northside neighborhood as historic landmarks.

The three single family homes along North Gilbert Street and the historic Fox Head Tavern on Market Street will be rezoned as historic landmarks, the Iowa City City Council unanimously decided at their Aug. 18 meeting.

The four historic properties have deep ties to Iowa City's brewing history, Czech immigrant heritage and the development of the Northside neighborhood.

### Historic properties highlight the early days of Iowa City

The three historic homes at 204, 210, and 214 N. Gilbert St. were built by Czech immigrants in the late 1800s, according to a memo from city staff.

The homes were cited as examples of the close relationship between residential, commercial and industrial development in Iowa City's Northside neighborhood. Workers, tradespeople, and business owners often lived near their workplace.

According to the city memo, the properties were near three historic

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# Meta reaches settlement over harm to children

## Iowa to receive \$136M in national agreement

Iowa will receive more than \$100 million as part of a massive national settlement over claims Instagram and Facebook failed to protect children on their platforms.

Meta Platforms agreed to pay a maximum \$16.68 billion as part of a settle-

ment to resolve states' claims that the company designed Facebook and Instagram to addict children, misled consumers about their safety, and improperly collected personal data of children who used its platforms, court papers show.

The settlement was reached during a California federal trial over claims brought by 29 states, averting one of the

highest-profile tests yet of allegations social media companies harmed young users.

Meta also agreed to make changes for teenage users of Facebook and Instagram nationwide, including daily usage limits and nighttime blocks, court papers show.

The Menlo Park, California-based company denied wrongdoing in agreeing to settle.

Shares of Meta rose 4.4% in pre-market trading.

### Iowa AG declares victory after lawsuit settles

The settlement will resolve a lawsuit Iowa Attorney General Brenna Bird filed in April, accusing the company of violating the Iowa Consumer Fraud Act.

In a statement announcing the deal, Bird called it a "massive win" and said Iowa is guaranteed to receive nearly \$135.7 million in 10 installments from

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
