Red Roses: A Vintage Cabaret set to revive golden age entertainment

Members of the Lake Pend Oreille Repertory and local theaters are planning to bring a one-of-akind show to The Hive next weekend.

A group of five local performers have formed a troop to present Red Roses: A Vintage Cabaret, a musical experience that harkens back to shows of the 1920s and 1930s. The Red Roses promise a night packed with a fusion of vintage glamour and modern favorites with plenty of crowd interaction.

"We're reviving the glamorous, respected song-and-dance entertainment that made the 1950s through '70s so iconic," Keely Gray, founder of the LPO Repertory and singer, said. "There's nothing like this in the inland Northwest. We're bringing vintage glam sophistication with local heart

and accessibility.' Gray built the team alongside Ashley Lopez, an international touring artist. Using her wealth of performing tools from contortion to opera singing, Lopez will lead the Red Roses through their routine of carefully curated musical numbers.

Holly Beaman, an LPO Repertory star, and Nicole Brianna, who goes by Nickie B on stage, has been dancing cabaret for over 20 years. Dressed in sequins and feathers accurate to the time period, that will create an intimate experience for attend-

Rounding out the Red Roses is the lone male rose, Andrew Sorg, a founding board member of the LPO Repertory. The show Nov. 22 will be the group's debut show at The Hive, attendees will be encouraged to buy roses before the show to throw on stage.

Idaho SNAP recipients should soon get full food assistance

Idaho health officials expect to have received full SNAP food assistance funding by Friday, and recipients should receive their benefits within 48 hours after that.

Amid the longest federal government shutdown in U.S. history, the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare had paused November benefits for the federally funded Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP.

Judge halts Kootenai **logging project over** impacts on grizzlies

A federal judge has halted a logging project in the Kootenai National Forest, saying the federal government failed to correctly analyze the impacts to grizzly bears.

The Knotty Pine Project, a 10-year project that would have authorized 7,465 acres of prescribed burning and 2,593 acres of commercial harvest in the Cabinet-Yaak Mountains, has been in litigation since 2022.

A steno in the shadows during Vietnam

The humid air of Nha Trang clung to everything — typewriters, uni-

forms and nerves alike. Michael J. Parkins, a young stenographer with the 5th Special Forces Group, Airborne, sat behind a battered metal desk in the headquarters compound, his fingers moving swiftly across the keys of an old Underwood machine. The impossible decisions. sharp clack-clack of The affair that shook each keystroke was his rifle fire, the rhythm of a their core — accusations, man serving in the quiet- secrecy and political est corner of a war that

was anything but quiet. Mike's orders placed him in the nerve center of Col. Robert B. Rheault, commanding officer of the 5th Group — a respected, formidable leader soon caught in what history would call "The Green Beret Affair." From his desk, Mike saw the undercurrents few ever would: classified memos, intelligence cables and the whispered tension of men burdened by the Special Forces to maneuvering — unfolded just a few doors away. Mike, though a clerk, became a quiet witness to history, typing reports that would later echo

through the Pentagon. But even amid that storm, life in Nha Trang had its flashes of light. Mike remembered the laughter when Martha Raye — the beloved "Colonel Maggie," honorary Green Beret and tireless entertainer visited the base. She moved through the compound like a whirlwind of lipstick and morale, cracking jokes, hugging


