Officials are seeking solutions to slow mail

SPRINGFIELD — The future of Springfield's postal distribution center remains uncertain, but leaders in affected industries are in talks to find solutions within their control over the delays in the delivery of mail.

U.S. Rep. Nikki Budzinski, D-Springfield, met with a group of people including those with businesses that send or receive mail, U.S. Postal Service employees and leaders, farmers, union See MAIL, Page 2A

'She was my sunshine'

Family, friends gather to remember woman fatally shot in Springfield

SPRINGFIELD - Rekeea Jackson-Mason was Nickey Alexander's oldest

Alexander said she taught her how to be a mom.

"Because of her, I was able to raise (my other seven children)," Alexander told The State Journal-Register. "She was my sunshine. She was my experiment. She was my teaching. She was my correction. She was my

first love. I fell in love with her the moment she was in my womb."

Jackson-Mason, 36, was fatally shot at a residence in the 1900 block of Holly Drive, on the southeast side of Springfield early on July 19.

Alexander, a former Springfield restauranteur who is now a celebrity chef and cook in Hollywood, California, organized a balloon release in Jackson-Mason's honor at Southwind Park on July 26.

About 75 to 80 people, including family members of Sonya Massey--the Springfield woman fatally shot by a now-former Sangamon County Sheriff's deputy who is facing first-degree

Trade talks intensify as Aug. 1st deadline approaches

WASHINGTON - With President Donald Trump's Aug. 1 tariff deadline fast approaching, countries whose exports are facing stiff fees have been in a scramble to ink trade deals with the United States that preserve as much access as possible to American mar-

The European Union and its 27member nation bloc became the latest of the United States' top trading partners to come to an agreement with Trump on July 27, joining the Philippines, Japan and Indonesia in announcing deals during July. The United Kingdom and Vietnam have also reached agreements with Trump.

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney said July 28 that his country was in the "intense phase" of the complex negotiations as it sought to avert a promised 35% tariff on imports that fall outside of an existing trade pact with the United States.

"There is a landing zone that's possible but we have to get there. We'll see what happens," Carney told reporters during a news conference.

A baseline tariff of 10% is currently in place for most countries, some two dozen of which received letters from Trump this month informing them that higher rates are on the way. They include Brazil, which Trump says he'll hit with a 50% levy; India, to which he said he'll apply a 26% rate; Canada, at 35%; and Mexico, which faces a 30% tariff.

Mexico, Canada and the EU are the the largest exporters of goods to the United States along with China, which
