### Inc. 5000 includes 6 area companies

Six Rockford-area companies are among those appearing on Inc. Magazine's list of the 5,000 fastest-growing private companies in the United States. Meant to showcase some of the hottest entrepreneurial businesses in the U.S., the Inc. 5000 list is published annually. There are 257 companies from Illinois that made the list, including five from Rockford and one from Machesney Park.

Companies on the list are ranked according to their percentage of revenue growth over three years, from 2021 to

2024. They must be privately owned, for-profit, based in the U.S., and independent — not subsidiaries or divisions of other companies as of Dec. 31, 2024.

The minimum revenue requirement is \$100,000 for 2021 and \$2 million for 2024. Inc. editors verify revenue data supplied by the companies via financial statements signed by the company's

CEO and a credentialed third party.

# Rockford identifies its most dangerous streets

A draft Rockford Traffic Safety Action Plan has identified city streets that are hot spots for severe traffic crashes.

Once approved, the action plan compiled with the assistance of the Region1Planning Council should allow the city to compete for federal grant funding that can be used to improve traffic, bicycle and pedestrian safety.

The report, in part, examined fatal and serious injury traffic crash data from 2017 to 2022 in Rockford as compiled by the Rockford Police Department and the Illinois Department of Transportation. Some of the streets are under the city's control while others are owned by the state of Illinois or Winnebago County.

During the analysis period, there were a total of 457 crashes resulting in serious injuries or fatalities. Of the 457 total crashes, 93 resulted in fatalities and 364 resulted in serious injuries. Rockford typically averages 13 fatal crashes annually. The report notes there were a whopping 30 fatal crashes in 2021.

The analysis identified areas of 11 Rockford streets with the highest concentration of serious crashes.

Length: 0.5 miles Severe Crashes: 8

**Crash Rate**: 76 per 100 million Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT)

### 11th Street

Area: Blackhawk Road to Samuel-

son Road **Length**: 1 mile

> Severe Crashes: 7 Crash Rate: 42 per 100 million VMT

### East State Street

Area: Dempster Road to Arnold Av-

enue **Length**: 0.9 miles

Severe Crashes: 6 Crash Rate: 10.5 per 100 million
