Springfield man faces charge of impersonating a police officer

A Chatham man who tried to repossess a car in Taylorville was charged with impersonating a police officer on Sept. 18.

Jordan J. Monroe, 34, is the owner and CEO of Urgent Rent-a-Car agency in Springfield.

Monroe also was charged with unlawful restraint at a first appearance before Judge Brad Paisley on Sept. 19. Both charges are felonies.

He was released under conditions of the SAFE-T Act.

According to Taylorville Police Chief Dwayne Wheeler, Monroe was in an Explorer SUV when he activated an app on his cell phone to mimic police lights. Monroe, who was wearing a safety vest, also used a spotlight on the car that was pulled over on East Main Cross Street in downtown Taylor-

Monroe was attempting to repossess the 2004 Chevrolet Cobalt that was registered to Urgent Rent-a-Car, Wheeler said.

During the stop, Monroe maced one of the car's occupants, according to Wheeler.

Officers seized Monroe's phone. Monroe has an Oct. 23 preliminary hearing in Christian County court.
