Veterans Service Office receives service van

GREENSBURG – The Veterans Service Office, in cooperation with the Decatur County Community Foundation has purchased a van to take local veterans to and from the

Richard Roudebush Medical Center

in Indianapolis.

Veterans Service Officer Ken Mobley told the Decatur County Commissioners at their meeting Monday that the van had been delivered to the office, and final details about its use and detailing were still being sorted out.

According to the DCCF, the pur-

chase price was funded by the Ella Jo Briggs Veterans Field of Interest Fund held at the Decatur County Community Foundation.

Ella Jo lost her first husband, Staff Sergeant Louis Mobley, during World War II at a very young age. Although she later met and married Roger D. Briggs, Ella Jo always held a special place in her heart for veterans.

As a result of her admiration for those who serve our country, Ella Jo worked with her financial advisor to create the Ella Jo Briggs Veterans Field of Interest Fund. The Fund

Communities rally as SNAP is cut

The current U.S. Government shutdown is the longest in U.S. history. It started Oct. 1 when Congress failed to pass a budget. It surpasses the previous longest shutdown, due to President Trump demanding \$5.7 billion for a border wall between the U.S. and Mexico. That shutdown spanned 35 days between Dec. 22, 2018 and Jan. 25, 2019.

Initially, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits were being frozen by the USDA Nov. 1 for lack of funding. Two federal judges issued orders releasing partial benefits for November. Approximately 1-in-8 Americans receive SNAP.

2023 U.S. Census data shows in Ripley, Rush and Decatur counties combined, 22.8% of households – approximately 2,034 households – receive SNAP. There are roughly 28,500 households in the tricounty area. Local food pantries are already seeing increased demand.

"People are inquiring. Some people, they're on that line where they don't have benefits or make a little too much to qualify they're calling," Melissa Foist, Greensburg Bread of Life executive director, said.

demand as winter approaches, but she's had more calls with the shutdown.

Darilyn Bedel, Rush County Community Assistance president, has also seen demand increase. "We're about 35% to 50% higher," Bedel said, than one to two months prior and with the shutdown, she's expecting further demand.

Programs like Meals on Wheels are seeing greater demand. Diana Robbins, Greens-

She typically sees greater burg Meals on Wheels director, has received more calls requesting information.

"Not that we don't always get calls," she noted, but she received three to four in one day during the last week in October.

"They don't say 'it's SNAP' when they call, they just want information," but she suspects it's SNAP due to timing.
