Company set for work on Mass Pike service plazas

Ireland-based Applegreen awarded \$750M for rebuilds, operation

The Ireland company selected by the Massachusetts Department of Transportation to rebuild and operate 18 highway service plazas throughout the state says it's ready to get to work.

Dublin-based Applegreen said it's investing \$750 million to rebuild nine plazas and renovate the other nine. The

work is expected to be completed over a three-year period (2026-28). Construction on the first six sites will begin Jan. 1.

"We design, we build, and then we operate these plazas," Applegreen co-founder and Chairman Bob Etchingham said. "We have relationships with all the major food brands. We focus (on that) pretty much exclusively — 95% of our revenue (comes) from food and beverage and travel plazas. That is what we do."

No two consecutive plazas will be closed at the same time, he said.

"We're committed to building worldclass travel plazas in the state of Massachusetts," Etchingham continued. "We see these as locations where an impression is formed by visitors of the state, and they need to be right up there with the very best that is available."

Applegreen owns more than 400 sites in the United States, United Kingdom and Ireland. The company has nine state contracts in the United States and more than 700 branded food and beverage outlets across global brands.

Waltham company urges MassDOT to reconsider decision

MassDOT's awarding of the contract to Applegreen, which followed an 18month process and included five other bidders, did not come without criticism.

Public health regulators approved the merger of UMass Memorial Medical Center and Marlborough Hospital on July 9, with the licensing overhaul deepening an existing affiliation that's expected to improve patient care and reduce operating costs.

The UMass Memorial Health system encompasses UMMMC, an academic medical center, and four community hospitals, including the 79-bed Marlborough Hospital. All hospitals in the system are licensed independently, and Marlborough Hospital is the smallest of the facilities, said Dennis Renaud, director of the Determination of Need program at the Department of Public Health.

The Public Health Council approved UMass Memorial Health's DoN application for a transfer of ownership, allowing Marlborough Hospital to become a licensed campus of UMMMC. Marlborough Hospital, while formerly
