### New England courts challenging Trump

### Litigants seek friendly venue to push back on president's policies

BOSTON – A federal judge in Boston had some pointed words for President Donald Trump as he issued one of the dozens of decisions by courts in four New England states against the Republican in challenges to the legality of his policies.

"I fear President Trump believes the American people are so divided that today they will not stand up, fight for and defend our most precious constitutional values so long as they are lulled into thinking their own personal interests are not affected," U.S. District Judge William Young wrote in ruling that Trump's administration was violating free speech rights by moving to deport non-U.S. citizen pro-Palestinian activists at American colleges.

## Nonprofit to rebuild part of historic cottage

The Sawin House is gone but not forgotten.

A nonprofit will begin fundraising to restore a portion of the historic Natick home during the first quarter of 2026 using pieces from the original home, according to Henry Haugland, head of Natick Heritage Inc.

"It became very clear that we weren't going to reach any agreement with the Massachusetts Audubon Society to preserve the house—short of moving the entire house," he said. "That wasn't feasible,

so we had to come up with a new plan."
The new plan is to rebuild the cottage constructed by Thomas Sawin in 1696, using some reclaimed parts of the original.

### Framingham man held on \$20K bail in fatal beating

A Framingham man accused of beating another man who later died was ordered held on \$20,000 bail during his arraignment on Tuesday, Nov. 18, in Framingham District Court.

Craig West, 39, was also ordered not to contact any witnesses or any family of victim Oezel Sari.

West is accused of beating Sari, also of Framingham, on Saturday on Concord Street. The Middlesex District Attorney's Office said the attack occurred about 4:55 p.m. and was caught on a nearby security camera.
