#### Marlborough condominium proposal seeks second chance

Hearing scheduled for Oct. 20

After the Marlborough City Council rejected a zoning amendment designed to create a 90-unit condominium project on Ames Street, developers plan to resubmit application materials for a public hearing on Monday, Oct. 20.

On Sept. 8, City Council voted against a zoning change that would have created the so-called Ames Village Overlay District. An overlay district is a zoning addition that modifies regulations on top of existing zoning. The Ames Street parcel is currently zoned for 23 single-family homes, but the developers, The Gutierrez Company and Marlborough/Northborough Realty Trust, are proposing the zoning change to allow residential condo units.

These homes would be considered "age-targeted," and include single-level flats, covered parking, elevators and no shared amenities, according to a presentation made in July.

#### City Council voted down proposal after initial approval

In July, the city Planning Board approved the

## Who's running for Framingham School Committee?

FRAMINGHAM — School Committee candidates involved in competitive elections in next month's biennial city election answered questions during a forum on Thursday, Oct. 9, at the Edwards Church in Saxonville.

The forum was hosted by AccessTV Framingham and moderated by Giuliano Espino, assistant professor of political science, law and global studies at Framingham State University.

In Framingham, each of the city's nine districts is represented on the School Committee. But only two of those seats are contested in next month's election — District 2 and District 6.

The city election takes place on Tuesday, Nov. 4. Espino asked all candidates the same three questions about teacher and student retention; in-house busing; and student life issues, including student
