MA Lottery replacing **Lucky for** Life game

Time's almost up for Lucky for Life. The Massachusetts Lottery early next year will stop offering the multistate draw that launched here in 2012 and will begin offering a Millionaire for Life draw game instead.

Tickets for the new game will cost \$5, compared to \$2 for Lucky for Life, and the grand prize will be \$1 million a year for life.

Drawings will still be held daily. The first drawing of Millionaire for Life is scheduled for Sunday, Feb. 22, 2026, the day after the last drawing of Lucky for Life.

The Lottery Commission last week voted unanimously to make the switch.

Asked why the Lottery was making the move, Mass. Lottery Executive Director Mark William Bracken said the decision on the multistate draw game

DOJ: Man was paid \$1.7M under the table

A Marlborough man has agreed to plead guilty to taking part in a multiyear scheme to cheat the Internal Revenue Service, according to the Department of Justice.

According to a press release, Stephen L. Hochberg, a former accounting and real estate executive, was paid more than \$1.6 million in compensation and fringe benefits under the table. The goal, according to the release, was to lie to the U.S. Attorney's Office about his income and avoid paying restitution to victims of an earlier fraud case.
