CAN ICE ENTER COLLEGE DORMS?

Gov. Healey responds to Columbia arrest

After U.S. Department of Homeland Security officials arrested a foreign student in her dorm at Columbia University Feb. 26, Massachusetts Gov. Maura Healey's administration responded in an attempt to prevent the same thing from happening at one of Massachusetts' many colleges and universities.

Officials at Columbia said that the DHS agents misrepresented them-

selves as police searching for a missing child in order to gain access to the residence hall. The agents entered Azerbaijan-born Columbia student Elmina Aghayeva's dorm, a building not open to the public, "without any kind of warrant," acting university President Claire Shipman said, and detained her.

In response, Healey and Massachusetts Attorney General Andrea Campbell reiterated March 2 that ICE does not have a right to enter non-campus facilities, including dormitories, with-

out a judicial warrant or judicial order, and that university students and staff have a right to demand one.

"It's outrageous that ICE agents lied in order to get into a residential building and arrest a Columbia student - but that's par for the course for these untrained federal agents who are doing President Trump's bidding and making us all less safe," Healey said.

Homeland Security said that the dorm building manager and Aghayeva's roommate permitted agents to enter. Aghayeva was ultimately freed several

Man who killed teen in '96 again seeks parole

Nearly 30 years after he killed a 17-year-old girl, a former Framingham man is seeking parole for a fifth time.

But the family of Kimberly Bolton, the teen who was murdered on Aug. 10, 1996, is asking the public to write letters to the state Parole Board in Natick, asking it to keep Damien Lockhart, 52, behind bars.

"My niece does not get a second chance at life," said Bolton's aunt, Carol Aitken-Young. "Damien Lockhart shouldn't receive one. She was more than a headline, more than a case number - she was a daughter, a sister, an aunt, a cousin, a niece and a friend. She had a future filled with promise and that future was stolen by Damien Lockhart, nearly 30 years ago."

Lockhart last sought parole a year ago. The Parole Board had just six

6 restaurants are opening new locations throughout MetroWest

From national chains to locally owned favorites, several restaurants are expanding throughout MetroWest. The activity features a mix of fast-casual and sit-down options that are already open or slated to debut in coming months.

Among the latest additions involves Chill Kitchen and Bar in Marlborough, which is set to open a second location in Westborough. The sit-down restaurant gained approval in June 2025 to open in the Westborough Shopping Center at 32A Lyman St., just off Route 9. The space formerly housed Ruby Tuesday's and Mexicali.

Chill Kitchen owner John Logomasini's original location is in the Marlboro

Square Shopping Center on Boston Post Road (Route 20). It opened in 2016.

The new Westborough restaurant is expected to open in April, the restaurant told the Daily News. Chill Kitchen and Bar serves American cuisine and cocktails as well as offering live music. During a June meeting, Westborough Select Board members unanimously approved the liquor license and said they looked forward to welcoming a new restaurant.

Ramen Haven, Sudbury

Ramen Haven, which operates in the Highland Commons Plaza straddling the Hudson-Berlin line, plans to open a second location in April in Sudbury's Meadow Walk Plaza, home to Whole
