BOSTON - A bill that would stiffen penalties for rowdy "street takeovers." including forfeiture of the motor vehicles involved, has been filed by state Rep. Chris Markey, D-Dartmouth.

'An act relative to protecting the public from street takeovers" is currently before the Joint Judiciary Committee and is headed for a public hearing, Markey said. The bill is co-sponsored by state Rep. Steven Xiarhos, R-Barnsta-

"We're seeing the potential dangers of it," he said. "Totally innocent people can be injured. The way these guys operate they could be injured, too," Markey said. Property damage is also highly

The New Bedford Planning Board listened to a revised proposal for a redesign of the original housing project and site plan as presented Wednesday, Nov. 12 by David Davignon with Schneider, Davignon and Leone representing the developer, 262 Bedford Street, LLC.

With the potential changes in the redesign of the project and site plan, Davignon said they are hopeful it will lead to project approval.

Proposing multiple reductions
