Millions lost to leaks

The Auditor-General, in her annual report, pointed out 273 issues where poor management and oversight led to millions of ringgit in leakages. Among them were:

- **Unreturned grant balances of RM183.11mil across four ministries involving 7,904 projects.**
- **Almost RM5mil was needed to treat fungal infestation of two blocks in Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia.**
- **The shelving of a RM1.06mil Covid-19 screening and monitoring tool. Nineteen prototypes of the tool went missing.**
- **Significant weaknesses in management of the MyDigital ID Development Project.**
