U.S., China hold new talks on tariffs

Analysts: Another 90-day truce extension likely

STOCKHOLM - Top U.S. and Chinese economic officials resumed talks in Stockholm on July 28 to resolve longstanding economic disputes at the center of a trade war between the world's top two economies, aiming to extend a truce by three months.

Treasury Chief Scott Bessent was part of a negotiating team that arrived at Rosenbad, the Swedish prime minister's office in central Stockholm. China's Vice Premier He Lifeng was also seen at

6 undergrads awarded summer research grants

Six students from Adrian College are spending their summer break conducting research projects, thanks to the school's 2025 Undergraduate Student Summer Research Grants.

Each student received a \$1,500 grant, along with room and board if needed, to support their research. The projects cover a wide range of topics, from chemical contamination in Michigan's aquifer system to artificial intelligence, according to an announce-

Ty Perin, a senior majoring in geology and environmental studies, is expanding on research conducted by his faculty sponsor, Professor Sarah Hanson. His project, titled "Correlation Between the Tectonic Origin of Pegmatites: A Tool for Evaluating Rare-Earth-Element Deposits," aims to differentiate between two types of pegmatites based on their formation

Hanson's research was successful in separating the two types, but she noted a "weird overlap field" in the data. The main economic interest in this research lies in the presence of heavy rare-earth elements in some pegma-
