DNR to add trail cameras to biannual elk survey

As researchers with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources seek to identify the best method for tracking the state’s elk population, they’re adding a new technique, using trail cameras, the DNR said in a news release.

The DNR plans to run its current aerial survey and the new camera data survey in 2026 to learn how their results and cost-effectiveness match up, per the department.

“We will compare the results from these different survey methods and balance the precision of the estimates they provide with the resources they require,” said Angela Kujawa, a DNR wild-

life biologist.

Trump seeks fast Russia-Ukraine deal

Meetings, negotiations still to be determined

The good news is President Donald Trump is determined to make a deal, and fast, to end the grinding war in Ukraine.

For the leaders of Ukraine and Europe, that could be the bad news, too.

Concern about what Trump would be willing to cede to Russia in his super-charged effort to reach an accord – the prime exhibit in his open campaign to win the Nobel Peace Prize – drew an extraordinary group of European leaders to the White House to back up Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy at a pivotal moment for Kyiv.

In the East Room on Aug. 18,

The Walks, Wags and Wiggles community fundraiser is organized by the Leadership Cheboygan Class of 2025 and will be held from 4-8 p.m. at the Cheboygan County Fairgrounds, according to a community announcement.
