## Monroe man's garage sale success becomes a store

Garage sale success turned into a business for Hunter Markavich of Monroe.

The 21-year-old owns and operates Premium Overstock Goods, a discount store selling overstock products from major retailers like Amazon, Target and Walmart.

"The business started as a small-scale garage sale and within the last two years it became an actual business," Markavich said. "Support from the community has allowed us to open this nice little storefront and provide good deals for people."

The store is located at 306 N. Telegraph Road and opened in November 2024.

It carries a variety of inventory, toys, health and beauty, electronics and clothing. Some products are seasonal items.

Current business hours are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Sunday, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday

through Thursday and Saturday and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday along with online auctions.

"We have mostly seasonal items," he said. "Right now, we have a lot of toys from Christmas, electronic and high-end products like RGB lights for your house and small-scale stuff like air pod cases, chargers and hair curlers."

Markavich posts items on Facebook and customers indicate they want the item in the comments section.

The item is marked as sold and must be paid for and picked up within seven days unless other arrangements have been made.

There are occasions the store will get high-end items like furniture and there have been times when Markavich has traveled out of state for inventory.

"We've hit Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana. It all depends on the season and what the market looks like," he said. "We like to post new items on our page daily and in terms of getting new shipments it's once or twice a week."
