Expanded health department site opens in Jefferson County

County was site of much strife during pandemic era

HILLSBORO - The Jefferson County Health Department has opened a new clinic and headquarters here in a major expansion that began even as the office and its leaders were the target of vocal public mistrust, threats and protests during the

COVID-19 pandemic. Jefferson County, the thirdmost populous county in the St. Louis metro area and majority politically conservative, was one of the most contentious spots in the region during the pandemic. Pushback is swift against new map

Effort underway to put redistricting proposal in front of Missouri voters

JEFFERSON CITY - Opponents of

a Republican-led effort to redraw the boundaries of Missouri's eight congressional districts outlined plans Monday to torpedo the scheme by taking it directly to the voters for ratification.

People Not Politicians, which has already raised an estimated \$850,000 to bankroll the campaign, said Monday it is collecting signatures to give voters a say in the controversial gerrymandering push designed to secure one additional safe Republican congressional seat for President Donald Trump in next year's midterm elections.

"We are out on the streets today gathering signatures with Missourians. We are prepared to let Missourians have the final say in this," People Not Politicians executive director Richard von Glahn told reporters Monday.

The groups opposed to the new maps say elected officials shouldn't get to pick who they represent.

"People should be at the center of our democracy, not politicians," von Glahn

The announcement comes as progressive organizations also are fighting the GOP redistricting plan in court. The ACLU has filed two challenges to the new maps, while the NAACP was in a Cole County courtroom Monday asking a judge to rule that the special session called by Gov. Mike Kehoe to redraw the boundaries was illegal.

FBI: DNA found with rifle a match

Vice president hosts Kirk's Monday show

OREM, Utah - DNA on a towel wrapped around a rifle found near where conservative activist Charlie Kirk was assassinated matched that of the 22-year-old accused in the killing, FBI Director Kash Patel said Monday.

Investigators also used DNA evidence to link the suspect, Tyler Robinson, with a screwdriver recovered from the rooftop where the fatal shot was fired, Patel told Fox News Channel on Monday.

Authorities in Utah are preparing to file capital murder charges against Robinson as early as Tuesday in the killing of Kirk, a dominant figure in conservative politics who became a confidant of President Donald Trump after founding Arizona-based Turning Point USA, one of the nation's largest political organizations.
