Testimony continues on second day of federal climate case

A federal judge in Missoula on Wednesday appeared skeptical of a request by 22 young plaintiffs to halt to a flurry of energy-related actions by the Trump administration this year.

The plaintiffs are alleging that actions following a trio of executive orders issued by President Donald Trump are endangering their federal rights to life and liberty by speeding up fossil fuel development and worsening the negative impacts of climate change.

Nearing the end of a two-day hearing on the case, U.S. District Judge Dana Christensen asked the plaintiffs

Montana Dem Party vice chair resigns 3 days after his election

The brand new Montana Democratic

Party vice chair resigned Wednesday afternoon only three days after he was elected to the position by more than 100 delegates at the organization's convention this past weekend.

Max Johansen's resignation came after he made comments to reporters at the convention that were critical of former

Democratic U.S. Sen. Jon Tester, which led Tester to eviscerate Johansen on his podcast a couple days later.

Johansen, the chair of the Park County Democrats, said Tester failed to adapt to the changing political landscape over the past several years, calling him part of the "old guard" that "represents a philosophy that no longer serves the interest of

City Council advances plan to let Missoula voters fill vacancy

A vacant Missoula City Council seat will likely remain unfilled for the next two months after council gave initial approval Wednesday to suspend its rules and allow the November election to play out to fill the spot.

Ward 1 Councilor Jennifer Savage vacated the seat on Sept. 5 to comply with state law after she filed for reelection in

Ward 3, the Missoulian previously reported. Under council rules, the open seat is supposed to be filled within 30

On Wednesday, council leadership proposed suspending its rules to wait for the results of the upcoming Ward 1 election in November, arguing that appointing a placeholder would be less
