Chiropractor Ed Earhart has enjoyed helping people for 45 years

Dr. Ed Earhart celebrated 45 years of serving clients as a chiropractor. Patients were treated to cake and punch in the office on Monday to mark the occasion.

Earhart said he decided he was going to become a chiropractor when he visited his brother, who was studying to be a chiropractor.

“He knew I had this problem with my leg going to sleep when I was driving,” he said. “He had an appointment lined up with a student doctor and they examined and did X-rays. I remember looking at that X-ray and I could see that the vertebrae was out of place. I’d been to my medical doctor, and they told me it was growing pains.”

He said he had two adjustments and drove home to Fairbury from Iowa and for the first time in about two years, his leg didn’t go numb.

“I usually had to stop after an hour or less. I got to Des Moines and then Omaha and didn’t have to

stop. By the time I was in Lincoln, I had decided I was going to be a chiropractor,” he said.

Earhart grew up in Fairbury with three brothers and one sister. He graduated from high school in 1975. Dr. Harold Jacot hired him right after he graduated from Palmer College.

“I worked with him for five years before starting my practice,” Earhart said. “We stayed friends for years. He taught me a lot about being a chiropractor and a man. He taught me about how to treat people.”

He had an office near the Carnegie Building for several years before moving to his current location at the corner of Sixth and Monroe Streets in March of 1982.

Earhart said the best part of being a chiropractor is helping people.

“People who have done everything else except for chiropractic, and we are able to help them or get rid of their problem. I’ve had people tell me it worked,

Trump slams his supporters

NEW YORK — President Donald Trump is lashing out at his own supporters, accusing them of being duped by Democrats, as he tries to clamp down on criticism over his administration’s handling of much-hyped records in the Jeffrey Epstein sex trafficking investigation, which Trump now calls a “Hoax.”

Pillen seeks 10% cut in next budget

LINCOLN — Nebraska Gov. Jim Pillen will seek a 10% cut to the state’s general fund budget next year in a move that a member of Pillen’s Cabinet acknowledged could cost some state employees their jobs and that critics warned would deal a blow to state services.

A spokeswoman for Pillen’s office confirmed to the Journal Star the governor has asked leaders of Nebraska’s code agencies — the state departments whose directors are appointed by Pillen — to “identify savings opportunities equivalent to 10% reductions” ahead of next year’s legislative session.

Lee Will, Nebraska’s chief operating officer and a member of Pillen’s cabinet, said the executive branch also expects noncode agencies like the University of
