Construction on Omaha's streetcar nears milestone

Work will shift to track-laying portion of project next year

While there is plenty more construction to come to replace aging infrastructure and lav rails for Omaha's streetcar, Mayor John Ewing said Wednesday that traversing the corridor will get easier once work shifts to the track-laying portion of the project next year.

A South Omaha man said he was in disbelief when police identified his childhood friend and coworker as the man who shot a gro-

the QuikTrip shooting. "He never showed signs," Fuentes said. "So it was kind of crazy for me to hear that."

Police said family members reported that Melgar-Ayala suffered from mental health-related issues. Fuentes said, as a co-worker, Melgar-Ayala didn't give any signs he was unwell, but he also didn't know if he had a support system.

"I wish he would have reached out to me," Fuentes said.

Fuentes said when another

former classmate told him the shooter was Melgar-Ayala, he didn't believe it at first. He said he'd always known Melgar-Ayala as just "Juan Melgar," and didn't know he had a second last name. But when he saw the body camera footage of the shootout released to local and national media, Fuentes said he recognized his friend's blue Nike Air Force shoes.

OPS saw no reason to question state aid

Some state ed board members say district could have caught \$30M error

Omaha Public Schools officials say they had no reason to question a \$30 million increase in state aid that the Nebraska Department of Education now says was calculated incorrectly.

At a State Board of Education meeting Friday, Nebraska Education Commissioner Brian Maher offered further details about the origin of an error in state aid calculations that will result in \$30.5 million being subtracted from funding for OPS for the 2026-27 school year.

Maher emphasized the department's responsibility for the error even as some state board members argued OPS could have caught the mistake.

OPS officials have stated the district expects a \$61 million budget shortfall next school year due to the funding subtraction and a decrease in funding moving for-

Part of the formula for determining state aid for school districts under Nebraska's Tax Equity and Educational Opportunities Support Act involves poverty allowances.

Beginning with the 2021-22 school year, the Nebraska Department of Education began incorrectly calculating those allowances in relation to the Community Eligibility Provision, Maher said during Friday's meeting.
