## Advocates urge voters to tell legislators to change school funding formula

Panel examines recent court cases at forum in Laconia Thursday night

LACONIA — More than 80 local residents concerned about the relationship between school funding and property taxes gathered for a panel discussion at Laconia High School on Thursday, where attor-

neys and lobbyists gave their insights and fielded questions on the topic.

The event was put on by the New Hampshire School Funding Fairness Project, and moderated by Phil McLaughlin, a former attorney general who argued the state's position in the Claremont cases of the 1990s and early 2000s. In these cases,

the NH Supreme Court issued two rulings that the state government must adequately fund education.

"Those cases, and their progeny, underline this evening's events," McLaughlin said.

The panel included NH School Funding Fairness Project Executive Director Zack
