## Feds release Cape May County beach replenishment funds

A series of beach replenishment and protection projects in Cape May County will be funded with \$99 million from federal programs as of this week, according to U.S. Rep. Jeff Van Drew.

The Philadelphia District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is to supervise these projects, which are to take place in Ocean City, Strathmere (Upper Township), Sea Isle City, Avalon and Stone Harbor.

"I have been working closely with the Army Corps to make sure South Jersey is a priority," Van Drew said this week, "and today we are seeing that pay off in a massive way."

Van Drew, a South Jersey Republican, said the \$99 million is the biggest allocation for a New Jersey beach project in a year without hurricane damage.

"This is a huge investment for our shoreline, one of the largest we have ever seen, and it is going to make a real difference," Van Drew said. "Our beaches are so important to South Jersey, and this level of investment means stronger protection, more stability, and peace of mind for our shore communities."

The 2026 fiscal year work plan for the

## Man takes plea deal of 13 years for shooting

An argument that turned into a "close range" shooting outside an Atlantic City bar is sending West Deptford resident Rockwell W. Pohlig to state prison for what could be more than a decade.

Pohlig accepted a plea agreement that recommends Atlantic County Superior Court Judge Donna M. Taylor sentence him to 13 years. The prison term would come with a condition that he must serve at least 85% of that time to become eligible for parole consideration.

The plea agreement also covers one drug offense
