## Man released in Guthrie disappearance probe

Person of interest seen in doorbell camera

More than a week after Savannah Guthrie's mother, Nancy Guthrie, went missing from her Arizona home in a possible kidnapping, law enforcement took a person in for questioning.

Pima County Sheriff's Department deputies "detained a subject during a traffic stop south of Tucson" and questioned the person "in connection to the Nancy Guthrie investigation," according to a statement obtained by USA TODAY. Details about the person have not been made public.

A man who was detained in Rio Rico, Arizona, in connection with the abduction said he was released after questioning, according to the New York Times and Fox News. Authorities said that they detained the person in connection with the Guthrie case during a traffic stop.

The sheriff's department did not share any information about what prompted officers to stop the person on the road.

The development in the case came hours after the FBI released photos and videos of a possible suspect, who was captured on film by Nancy Guthrie's doorbell camera. The person, who wore a ski mask and gloves and appeared to be "armed," per FBI Director Kash Patel, has not been identified by law enforcement.

Authorities have not identified the masked person but Patel did describe that person as "of interest."

"I do believe we are looking at people who, as we say, are persons of interest," Patel said of the surveillance footage taken from a supposedly deactivated Google Nest doorbell camera. "But as you know with any investigation, you are a person of interest until you're either eliminated or you're actually found to be the culprit or the culprits involved."

Nancy Guthrie, 84, was "taken" from her home located outside of Tucson in the early hours of Feb. 1, authorities have said. Savannah Guthrie and her siblings have since issued emotional pleas for her

## South Jersey deli eyes comeback despite bankruptcy filing

The Kibitz Room, a popular deli-style restaurant in Cherry Hill, has filed for bankruptcy protection from its creditors.

But the currently closed business could see a comeback, according to a member of the family that's run the eatery for decades.

"I'm working with the landlord right now," Brandon Parish, who operates The Kibitz Room King of Prussia, said in an email Feb. 9.

"We are in the process of taking the location over,

but a few things need to be done before [then]."

The Kibitz Room, known for its massive sandwiches, has operated for approximately 25 years at the Shoppes at Holly Ravine at Springdale and Evesham roads. The business takes its name from the Yiddish word for "chat."

Parish said his mother, Sandy Karten Parish, operates the Cherry Hill restaurant.

"My mother closed it," said Parish, noting that he's helped run the South Jersey deli in the past.

The restaurant owner filed for Chapter 7 bankruptcy, which typically involves the sale of assets to satisfy debts. Its filing claimed assets of less than \$50,000 and liabilities of \$100,000 to \$500,000.

"After any administrative expenses are paid, no funds will be available to unsecured creditors," the filing said.

The Feb. 6 filing does not provide a summary of its liabilities, but noted that creditors include The Bagel Spot of Cherry Hill, Seashore Produce of Vineland and the New Jersey Division of Taxation.

An attorney for the restaurant's operator, Kibitz Management Inc., couldn't be reached for immediate comment.
