Former Millville Area School District Superintendent Tony Trongone is also listed as a defendant in a recent court opinion.

Jacqueline Cruz, according to her lawsuit, started working for the Millville school district in 2009, starting out as a long-term substitute. Over the years she served as a bilingual teacher, where she taught students both English and Spanish, and provided English as a Second Language (ESL) instruction.

In 2021, the Millville district's PK-5 supervisor of curriculum retired, leaving an open position. The full title of the position was "PK-5 Supervisor of Curriculum and Instruction-Language Arts/Social Studies/World Language/Bilingual and ESL," according to the lawsuit documents.

According to Bumb's opinion, district administrators said they hadn't yet finalized which position

VINELAND — City officials have approved a small expansion to mining at the Dun-Rite Sand and Gravel Co. property along Mays Landing Road near Sherman Avenue.

Dun-Rite presented a site plan to Vineland officials at the planning board hearing Aug. 12. The expansion didn't require any use variances or design waivers, and approval was unanimous.

This expansion amounts to approximately 8.77 acres, which, according to project engineer Stephen Nardelli, brings that mining area to about 790 acres. The area is zoned for “woodland” uses by the city, but mining is listed as a conditional use.

City staff and Nardelli noted that the site isn't far from a National Wild and Scenic River site, but that a quarter-mile buffer lies between them.
