NJ couple conquers ultimate travel bucket list

Angie and Robert Penna traveled to all 193 United Nations member countries

If you think planning a summer vacation is tough, think of what it must have taken to travel to all 193 United Nations member countries.

That’s exactly what a Franklin Lakes couple did. For accomplishing the goal of traveling to all the member countries of the U.N., plus 22 other territories, Angie and Robert Penna were named U.N. Grandmasters of Travel by the group Most Traveled People at a June conference near Lisbon, Portugal.

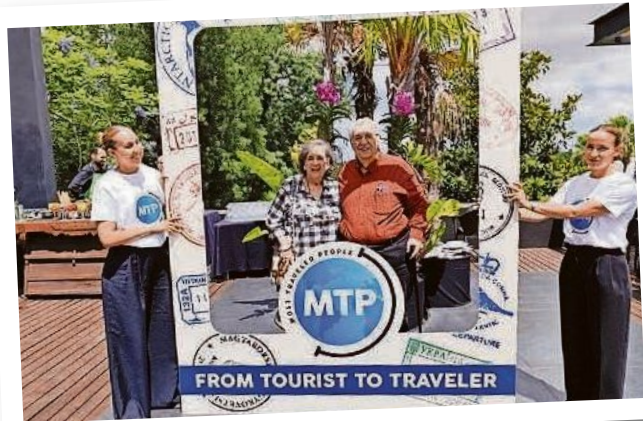
The Pennas are among fewer than 400 individuals and one of 12 married couples who have documented reaching that goal with the “extreme travel” organization.

“We have traveled as a couple for the 56 years we have

Could DNA tools solve 30-year-old Edison killing?

EDISON – Irwin Edelman has not been forgotten.

More than 30 years ago, Edelman, 72, of West Orange, owner of Acme Check Cashing at 1259 Route 1 South in Edison, was fatally shot in the abdomen during an attempted robbery while closing the business’s outdoor security gate.

The gunman was described as a man about 6-foot-2 with a thin-to-medium build. He was wearing a black ski mask and dark clothing and carrying a dark-colored handgun.

The suspect fired multiple shots before fleeing the scene. Edelman died at a hospital the following day.

Last week, Mayor Sam Joshi, the township’s public safety director, and Police Chief Thomas Bryan announced

Mom regains movement after hands, foot severed in stabbing

SOUTH RIVER – A borough mother is regaining movement in her hands and foot after they were severed during a stabbing incident involving her husband at a Kamm Avenue home in June.

Mayor Peter Guindi said doctors were able to reattach both hands and a foot, and the woman is on the road to recovery. Her name has not been released.

“They are both on, both hands are back on, her foot is back on,” Guindi said. “She does have motion in her hands as well as her feet, but it’s
