

Officer who rebuilt his life helps detainees find jobs

Former Farmington Police officer Shuttleworth runs jail program

A former police officer who needed to change careers found a new calling at the San Juan County Detention Center, where he helps detainees find work upon their release.

Robert Shuttleworth, 31,

oversees the Helping Offenders Achieve Purposeful Employment, or HOAPE, program at the jail.

The program is in its infancy. It was developed by Daniel Webb, the jail administrator, to help detainees nearing release find high-paying, full-time jobs in the community.

“When they are coming up on their release date, they fill out a generic application from second-chance employers,” Webb said, adding that if the employer is interested, the jail facilitates the interview process, as well as any testing that might need to be completed.

“The hope is we have job of-

fers prior to release, and an individual knows they show up Monday morning to a well-paying, full-time job,” Webb said.

Shuttleworth, who said he “is in the human services business,” made a mistake that changed his life and forced
