Golden CEO buying company

VICI will acquire its casinos in \$1.16B leaseback

Golden Entertainment Inc. will go private under a deal announced Thursday that sees its chairman and chief executive, Blake Sartini, buying the business operations while real estate investment trust VICI Prop-

erties acquires its casino properties in a sale-leaseback transaction valued at roughly \$1.16 billion.

VICI will acquire seven Golden Entertainment casino real estate assets, including The Strat at the north end of Las Vegas Boulevard, the Aquarius and Edgewater resorts in Laughlin, the

Pahrump Nugget and the two Arizona Charlie's casinos in Las Vegas, according to a news release.

Sartini will lease those properties from VICI under an initial rent payment totaling \$87 million per year, based on the terms of a

Lap seatbelt at issue in \$64.8M request

A prominent Las Vegas attorney asked a jury Thursday to award \$64.8 million to a woman seriously injured in a crash while wearing a lap belt as a passenger in a pick-up truck.

"Allie Mead did what every parent teaches our children to do," said Robert Eglet, who represents Mead in her lawsuit against General Motors. "She buckled her seat belt. She followed the rules. She trusted that the company who designed and built that truck, designed and

installed the seat belt, would protect her, not injure her, or at least warn her about potential dangers. That trust was shattered, like her spine, not by accident, but by not installing a lap-shoulder seat belt in the seat Allie sat in."
