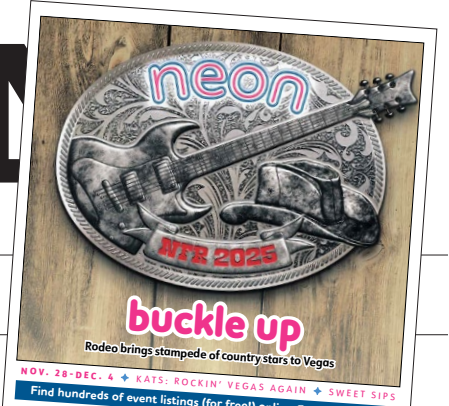

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Soldier shot in D.C. dies

Suspect ID'd as Afghan who served in CIA-backed military unit

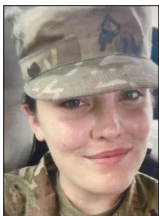

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. — President Donald Trump said that one of the two West Virginia National Guard members shot by an Afghan national near the White House had died, calling the shooter who had worked

with the CIA in his native country a “savage monster.” As part of his Thanksgiving call to U.S. troops, Trump said that he had just learned that Spc. Sarah Beckstrom, 20, had died, while Staff Sgt. Andrew Wolfe, 24, was “fighting for his life.” “She’s just passed away,” Trump said. “She’s no longer with us. She’s looking down at us right now. Her

parents are with her.” The president called Beckstrom an “incredible

person, outstanding in every single way.” Trump used the announcement to say the shooting was a “terrorist attack” as he criticized the Biden administration for enabling Afghans who worked with U.S. forces during the Afghanistan War to enter the U.S. The president has de-

Putin says he is open to talks

Draft agreement a starting point

U.S. proposals to end the war between Russia and Ukraine offer a starting point for talks, Russian President Vladimir Putin said Thursday, as he told Ukrainian forces to pull back or be over-run by Russia’s bigger army. “We need to sit down and discuss this seriously,” Putin told reporters at the end of a three-day visit to Kyrgyzstan. “Every word matters.” He described President Donald Trump’s plan as “a set of issues put forward for discussion” rather than a draft agreement.

Worry rises over e-scooter, e-bike injuries
