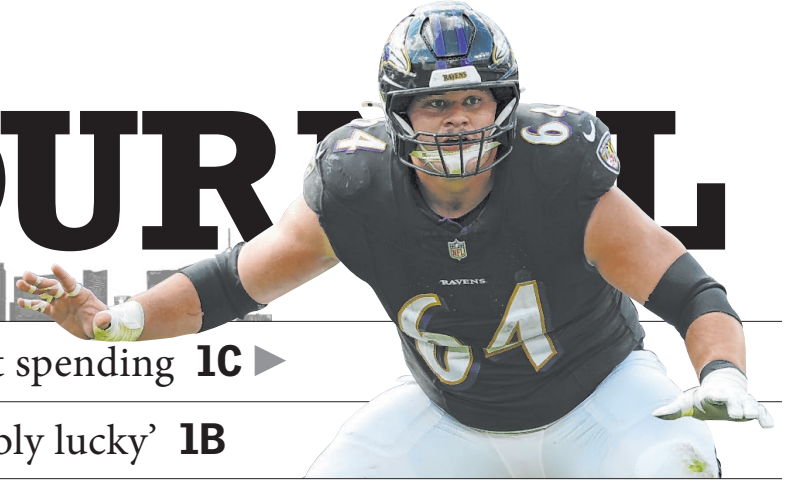

Trump thinks end of war 'very soon'

President aims 'to keep the oil prices down'

WASHINGTON — President Donald Trump said Monday he plans to waive oil-related sanctions, have the U.S. Navy escort tankers through the Strait of Hormuz and predicted the war with Iran would resolve "very soon."

The president said he did not believe the conflict would be over this week but noted the operation was ahead of schedule. He vowed bombing "at a much, much harder level" if Iran disrupted oil supplies alongside his sanctions pledge.

"We're looking to keep

the oil prices down," Trump said at a news conference at his resort in Doral, Florida. "They went artificially up because of this excursion."

The president did not offer additional specifics, beyond acknowledging he had discussed the topic with Russian leader Vladimir Putin in a phone call Monday. Russia has faced sanctions on its oil revenue in an international bid to deprive the country of revenue over its war in Ukraine.

As a whole, Trump's remarks underscored a new willingness by the White House to publicly indicate that it could be moving soon to attempt to wrap up the conflict.

"Together with our Israeli partners, we're crushing the enemy in an overwhelming display of technical skill and military force," Trump told Republican lawmakers earlier Monday.

At the news conference later, the president said the U.S. had hit 5,000 targets in the country, that Iran's missile capability was down to 10 percent, and that drone launches from the country had decreased 83 percent. The U.S. military objectives could be described as "pretty well complete," Trump said.

At the same time, Trump acknowledged unanswered questions that remained

FBI: New details on bio lab in valley

Flu vaccine, test kit components found

Materials used in the development of diagnostic test kits and flu vaccines were among the samples found inside a northeast Las Vegas Valley home that was described by authorities as a possible biological laboratory, the FBI said.

In a statement emailed on Friday, a spokesperson for the Las Vegas field office of the FBI offered more information about what federal agents and Metropolitan Police Department officers found after they executed a search warrant Jan. 31 at a home on Sugar Springs Drive, near North Hollywood Boulevard and East Washington Avenue.

"Laboratory testing conducted by the FBI determined the items recovered were primarily consistent with components used in the development of medical diagnostic test kits, including materials commonly associated with lateral-flow testing," said the statement from FBI spokesperson Sandra Breault. "Also recovered were components you would find in the Influenza A & B vaccines."

Lateral-flow tests are typically used for rapid detection of certain diseases, pathogens, chemicals and toxins, according to the National Center for Biotechnology Information.

The components found in flu vaccines didn't pose a threat to public health, Breault said.

"The FBI's analysis also identified older influenza samples; however, full genetic sequencing confirmed

Judge to alleged flamingo torturer: Obey or else

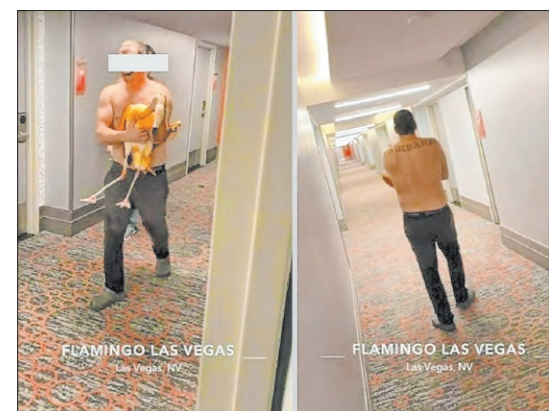
A judge warned a lawyer Monday that there would be no second chances for a Canadian tourist accused of bird-napping and torturing a flamingo at a Strip resort.

"You need to admonish your client that if he has a single violation while he's out on bail and electronic monitoring that was set by

the judge in initial appearance court, he is going to be remanded without bail in this case," Las Vegas Justice of the Peace Harmony Letizia said.

Mitchell Fairbairn, 33, who did not appear before the judge, faces four counts of torturing, maiming or killing an animal kept for companionship or pleasure.
