Trump to blockade strait

President: All Iranian ports included in plan

ISLAMABAD — President Donald Trump on Sunday said the U.S. Navy would swiftly begin a blockade of ships entering or leaving the Strait of Hormuz, after U.S.-Iran ceasefire talks in Pakistan ended without an

agreement.

U.S. Central Command announced that it will blockade all Iranian ports beginning Monday at 7 a.m. PDT, or 5:30 p.m. in Iran.

CENTCOM said the blockade will be "enforced impartially against vessels of all nations." It said it would still allow ships traveling between non-Iranian ports to transit the Strait of Hormuz.

Trump wants to weaken Iran's key leverage in the war after demanding that it reopen the strait to all global

traffic on the waterway that was responsible for 20 percent of global oil shipping before fighting began.

Traffic in the strait has been limited even in the days since the ceasefire. Marine trackers say over 40 commercial ships have crossed since the start of the ceasefire.

A U.S. blockade could further rattle global energy markets.

Oil prices rose in early market trading on Sunday after the blockade announcement.

The price of U.S. crude rose

NSU's dominant flag football debut makes last 2 foes cancel

The Scorpions just finished an undefeated inaugural season in which they won eight of 13 games by shutout while outscoring opponents by an average of 42 points. They built such a reputation that their final two oppo-

nents canceled games that would have been played last week.

"How our season has gone, teams don't want to come out here to lose," said coach Brandon Pappillion, who coached at Bishop Gorman before taking over

at NSU. "It was very disappointing. One canceled, then the next day the other called to cancel."

The Scorpions surprised opponents, but they did not surprise themselves.

"Going undefeated was our goal from the beginning," Pappillion said.

But there were no playoff wins. Though the Scorpi-

Hungary PM Orbán ousted after 16 years

BUDAPEST, Hungary — Hungarian voters ousted long-serving Prime Minister Viktor Orbán on Sunday after 16 years in power, rejecting the authoritarian policies and

global far-right movement that he embodied in favor of a pro-European challenger in a bombshell election result with global repercussions.

It was a stunning blow for Orbán — a close ally of both President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin — who quickly conced-

ed defeat after what he called a "painful" election result. Vice President JD Vance had made a visit to Hungary days earlier, meant to help push Orbán across the finish line.

Election victor Péter Magyar, a former Orbán loyalist
