## Twisted Rail FLX coming to Manchester

### Craft beer, barbecue and cannabis spot to open in March

Twisted Rail FLX is coming to Manchester, Ontario County, and along with it craft beer, barbecue and cannabis products.

Renovation work has started at the former Roy's Restaurant building on state Route 96, with the hope of opening a retail cannabis store by the end of March.

Like its main location in Geneva, the building will house both aspects of the Twisted Rail business – a craft beer tasting room and a barbecue restaurant on one side and cannabis on the other. The restaurant portion is expected to open later in the spring, perhaps by Memorial Day, co-owner Ian Boni said.

"There's not a lot we have to do except 'Twisted Rail-ify' it," Boni said. "We're excited. We're hoping this year is better than 2025."

#### Twisted Rail FLX's niche

The decision to open in Manchester follows the closing of its Macedon, Wayne County, location last year. The news comes on the heels of an announcement that Rebel Sailor Brewing Co. in Shortsville, Ontario County, will be closing Feb. 28.

ReInvention Brewing Co. operates in the village of Manchester near the new Twisted Rail location, and another brewery and restaurant operation coming to Shortsville, Wheel Works Brewing, is a few months away from opening.

Boni said Twisted Rail FLX will serve a niche. "We're here to offer you both. When it comes to

## From 'buy America' to 'bye America'

### Wall Street exodus picks up pace as investors shift to overseas markets

LONDON – U.S. investors are pulling money out of their own stock market at the fastest pace in at least 16 years as Big Tech returns fade and better-performing overseas markets look more attractive.

In the last six months, investors in the United States have pulled some \$75 billion from U.S. equity products, with \$52 billion flowing out since the start of 2026 alone, the most in the first eight weeks of the year since at least 2010, according to LSEG/Lipper data.

The shift comes despite a weakening of the dollar against other currencies,
