Man with gun shot, killed by police

No one else injured in incident at Moose Lodge

Columbus police say officers shot and killed a man accused of pointing a gun at someone at a fraternal organization on Columbus' Northeast Side.

At 10:01 p.m. March 31, officers were dispatched to the 1900 block of Schrock Road near Interstate 270 on Columbus' Northeast Side, Columbus police said in a news release.

A caller told police someone had a gun, was irate, and was pointing a gun at another person, according to the release. Dispatch news partner NBC4/WCMH reported the man made his way into a private club for the Loyal Order of the Moose on Schrock Road and was acting out.

New Columbus airport CEO talks new terminal, Europe flights and more

Daren Griffin, the new president and CEO of Columbus Regional Airport Authority, says of a possible nonstop flight to Europe from Columbus: 'It's not a question of if. It's just a question of when.'

Daren Griffin is taking over as president and CEO of the Columbus Regional Airport Authority at a pivotal moment for air travel in central Ohio. Construction crews are building John Glenn Columbus International Airport's new \$2 billion terminal project.

Oil price increases drive up fares and cut in on airlines' margins, Griffin said. Airlines may eventually cut flights around the country if costs get too high.

Before coming to Columbus, Griffin led the Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority, where he oversaw a \$1 billion capital improvement plan at the Reno-Tahoe Airport. Before that, he spent 16 years at the Port of Portland, Oregon, which operates Portland International Airport and two regional airports, Hillsboro and Troutdale.

Griffin took over the Columbus airport authority from Joseph Nardone, who led the organization for eight years before retiring in January. He was a ma-

job force behind the airport's \$2 billion new terminal project. Griffin has a salary of \$475,000.

The Columbus Regional Airport Authority oversees the operation of John Glenn Columbus International Airport, Rickenbacker International Airport and the small Bolton Field airport in southwestern Franklin County.

So far, Griffin said his transition has been going well.

'[It's] a lot about learning all the new people that are in the organization and the community leaders and learning about central Ohio, the economy, the

Hung jury declared in FirstEnergy bribery trial

State prosecutors plan to retry two former FirstEnergy executives on bribery and other charges after jurors in the weeks-long trial announced March 31 they couldn't reach a verdict on any of the charges.

The jury deliberated for nine days, telling Judge Susan Baker Ross they had reached an impasse March 30 and receiving instructions to continue to try to reach a unanimous decision.

Defendants Charles 'Chuck' Jones, former FirstEnergy CEO, and Michael Dowling, ex-FirstEnergy senior vice
