'Every game matters': Is this UD's year?

Dayton opens sold-out season Monday against Canisius University.

The 121st season of Dayton Flyers men's basketball begins this week with great expectations, as is the case every year these days.

The University of Dayton plays Canisius University of Buffalo,

New York, at 7 p.m. Monday at UD Arena. The game is sold out. The whole season, in fact, is sold out for the fifth straight year. Dayton's sellout streak will reach 94 games in March.

"Next Monday, it's real," Dayton coach Anthony Grant said last week after the team's second exhibition game. "We've got a week now to see where we can kind of tighten the screws a little bit so that as we move forward we can be the best versions of ourselves. It's a process. We haven't arrived at anything. It'll be a process throughout the year. The mindset is just to keep getting better."

Dayton beat Penn State 78-62 and Bowling Green 90-59 in the preseason, boosting optimism around a team with many unknowns.

"I think we got better today," Grant said after the Bowling Green game Monday.

U.S. has allowed, aided sale of tech to China for years

Issue a contentious one; Congress often turns a blind eye to appease industry lobbyists.

U.S. lawmakers have tried four times since September last year to close what they called a glaring loophole: China is getting around export bans on the sale of powerful American AI chips by renting them through U.S. cloud services instead.

But the proposals prompted a flurry of activity from more than 100 lobbyists from tech companies and their trade associations trying to weigh in, according to disclosure reports. The result: All four times, the proposal failed, including just last month.

As leaders Donald Trump and Xi Jinping had their long-heralded meeting last week, the sale of

Election Day is Tuesday: What you need to know

Be informed about ID requirements, ballot issues, more.

Election Day is Tuesday, with thousands of local voters already casting a ballot on local issues and races that impact their communities.

Polling locations will open across the state at 6:30 a.m. on Tuesday and stay open until 7:30 p.m. Early, in-person voting at local boards of elections ends on Sunday.

Here's everything voters need to know ahead of casting a ballot:

Voting options

There will be no voting at election board offices on Monday, but voters who want to cast their ballots in person can do so at their assigned polling locations on Tuesday. Voters can find their polling locations at voterlookup.ohiosos.gov or through their election board's website.

Voters who received an absentee ballot from their election board have until Monday to mail it. Ballots need to be postmarked by Monday, Nov. 3. Ballots sent to election boards by mail will need to arrive by Saturday, Nov. 8.
