



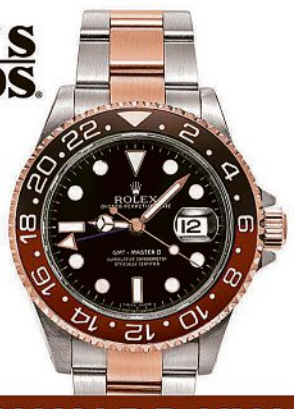

Empty buildings are an eyesore for a community. Therefore, city officials want to fill the Giant Eagle building at 1394 Ety Shops Way after the company said it is closing the store there.

However, city economic development director Stephanie Bosco said the city cannot formally market the building.

"We have had developers reach out to us and say, 'What would you like to see there?'" Bosco said. "And, essentially then, they would go and try to

## What public records reveal about the Siders family

Publicly available records provide minimal information about four adults accused of keeping 16 children in conditions likened to a third-world country and abusing them for years.

Gary Siders Sr., 73, Gary Siders Jr., 36, Elizabeth Siders, 33, and Catherine Siders, 67, are each facing 16 counts of felony endangering children in Vinton County Common Pleas Court.

## Ex-Sugar Grove officer remembered

Wayne County Sheriff Thomas Ballinger worked with Rittman police Sgt. Scott Ries when both were deputies in the agency he now leads.

On the morning after Ries was killed in the line of duty, he described the fallen officer as "a good man" and "just a great person."

"He would be there if you needed him," Ballinger said.

The sheriff was among those who gathered outside the Rittman Police Department in the late morning of July 6, the day after Ries was killed in a shooting while responding to a call about a break-in and shots fired on Chippewa Trail.
