# Rents could go up, landlords warn

A plan to provide homeowners with property tax relief could hurt another subset of Ohioans: renters.

Housing providers say they'll be forced to raise rents if Gov. Mike De-


Wine approves House Bill 186, one of four property tax bills that lawmakers passed before Thanksgiving. The bill primarily aims to limit tax increases, but a last-minute addition would eliminate a tax break that benefits some landlords.

Unlike recent summers, which showcased a mix of country and classic rock, the event will be pure country, featuring Rascal Flatts, Billy Currington, Joe Nichols, Craig Morgan, Darryl Worley, Neal McCoy, Shenandoah and Terri Clark.

The two-day music festival is Aug. 14 and 15 at Clay's Resort Jellystone Park near Canal Fulton. The annual event - a companion to the popular Country Fest at the site — attracts thousands of concertgoers.
